**ATTENDANCE & TEST RULES**

- **Attendance:** This class allows **TWO** unauthorized absences. If the student exceeds the above allowable absences an Instructor Initiated Absence Warning/Drop form may be sent to the student. See me if you're having a problem with attendance. Students are responsible for getting notes from class(es) missed.
  
- **Test Information:** Test dates are subject to change. Students will be notified in advance. No student will sit for any exam if he/she is more than **15 minutes late, NO EXCEPTIONS!**. Once the student puts their hands on a exam you have to take the exam. If you **miss any of the scheduled exams** the make-up date is April 11<sup>th</sup>, 2006 at 7:00a.m., Room C-133. The last day to drop a course with a **"W"** is March 17<sup>th</sup>, 2006. Each test is worth **33%** of your final grade and derived from your text book and class notes. Letter grading occurs on a 10-point scale: **A=89.51-100; B=79.51-89.50; C=69.51-79.50; D=59.51-69.50; F=Below 59.51**. Students are welcomed to look over their exam after they have received their grade.
  
- **Extra credit** is possible and can be achieved by one of two ways. 1. Attend an on-campus seminar. Showing dates will be announced soon. Students **MUST** show up on time and stay for the entire seminar. You may also find extra credit on your own. The extra credit event must last longer than an hour, be approved by Mr. Meehan prior to the student's attendance, and related to psychology. The cut-off date for approval of extra credit event is April 17<sup>th</sup>, 2006. The date of the off-campus extra credit event must occur on or before April 21<sup>st</sup>, 2006. **NOTE:** Students who attend an off-campus extra-credit event **must bring proof of attendance** on or before the above date.
